Overview

The IOM Bohol Operations cover the affected municipalities of Bohol with camp coordination and camp management needs, information and communication gaps, and emergency shelter needs especially in the underserved areas. For full recovery shelter and shelter repair kit intervention, the operations focus on the 17 most affected municipalities based on the magnitude of shelter damage as determined by the shelter cluster.

Status

Shelter

- 12,723 emergency shelter-grade tarpaulins distributed in affected municipalities, especially the underserved areas.
- 25 full recovery shelters completed and 25 on-going construction in the municipalities of Cortes, Maribojoc, Antequera and Loon.
- Providing information management support to the Bohol provincial government in the finalization of the shelter beneficiary list through the Emergency Response Database.

Communication with Communities

- Produced information materials on shelter and counter-trafficking. Printing of 8000 copies on building-back better shelters on-going.
- Assessment of effective communication media conducted. Distribution of 2000 solar radios is set.

Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

- Five CCCM trainings conducted for 297 participants composed of local government officers, staff and public officials from 16 municipalities and the provincial government.
- Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) rolled out to monitor needs and gaps in evacuation camps. Four (4) DTM results shared to partners through cluster meetings and reports providing crucial information in finding long term solution to the displacement.
- Coordination with local government and partners for the identification and activation of CCCM focal points.
