IOM in the Philippines: Overview

- IOM and the Government of the Philippines have long-standing relations
- IOM's work in the Philippines dates back to 1975
- 2002: IOM established the Manila Administrative Centre
- Over 350 staff, of which 300 are national staff members
- Philippines: Member State in 1988




Manila Administrative Centre

- IOM's global administrative centre
- Over 250 staff, 225 of which are national staff
- Provides global services in areas of finance, HR, IT, procurement, communication

IOM in the Philippines: Overview

- Has 117 operational staff working on 84 projects in the Philippines
- IOM Philippines serves the strategic needs of the country in the area of:
 - Labour Migration & Migration and Development
 - Canadian orientation services
 - Migration Health
 - Counter trafficking and Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration
 - Humanitarian Emergencies



Labour Migration and Migration & Development

- Socio-economic reintegration programme
- Mainstream M&D into government development planning
- Localize benefits of migration
- Migration Resource Centers
- Migrant rights orientation and safe migration campaigns





Canadian Orientation Services

 Established in 2008 as a pre-departure orientation project

- Funding from Citizenship and Immigration Canada
- Delivered in 34 countries through 55 training sites
- 2013, 13,945 migrants received
 Canadian orientation
- Benefits an annual average of almost 6,000 Filipinos migrating to Canada





Migration Health

- Enhanced immigration health assessments for Canadian visa applicants
- Pre-departure UK TB Detection
- Emergency preparedness and capacity building for healthcare personnel and community leaders
- Healthcare and psychosocial wellbeing needs in emergencies
