### Overview

The IOM Tacloban Hub covers Tacloban City and the Western towns of the island of Leyte severely affected by Typhoon Haiyan including the adjacent towns of Santa Rita and Basey in the province of Samar.

The hub's operations include the management of displacement through Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), the distribution of emergency and recovery shelter kits and non-food items, and the provision of protective and health services to typhoon-affected persons.

### Status

#### CCCM

- Site upgrades: family partitions, cooking counters, bathing cubicles under construction in Astrodome.
- Supporting DSWD and Tacloban City Government in finalization of bunkhouse beneficiary list based on DAFAC database underway.
- Coordination with local governments for the identification and activation of displacement management focal points
- NFIs distributed to 75 HHs in Leyte National High School EC.

#### Health

- Community health nurses have been deployed in ECs to conduct case monitoring, identify health referrals and community health education.
- No current outbreaks or increase in diarrhea however with ongoing rains and flooding there's a need to be vigilant and start contingency planning.

#### Protection

- ESKs (tarps) distributed to Brgy. 89 and Brgy. 90 in Tacloban City.
- Assessments for recovery shelter kit (RSK) distribution scheduled 22 January.
- Partnership agreements for ESK distribution and supply of coco lumber for RSK in process.
