
Guiuan Area of Operations 15 January 2014





Context

- 8 November passage of Super Typhoon Yolanda, with the eye passing directly over Guiuan
- Highest windspeed at landfall of any cyclone in recorded history
- 59,194 displaced persons (either at displacement sites, with host communities or at their place of origin) in E Samar
 - 30,625 houses destroyed, 31,116 damaged
- Massive damage to schools, public buildings, health facilities, electricity, water and sanitation and other public infrastructure
- · Major disruption to livelihoods







Emergency Shelter and NFIs



- · IOM serves as Shelter Cluster co-lead for the Guiuan AOR
- · Overall, 102% coverage for emergency shelter
- · IOM distributed emergency shelter kits (ESK), including tarpaulins, fixing kits and tool kits to 11,405 HH
- · IOM distributed NFIs (blankets, mats, hygiene kits, etc.) to 6,276 HH





Recovery Shelter

- · Substantial gaps exist in recovery shelter programmes: 61% (37,537 families)
- · IOM's programme consists of shelter repair and transitional (core) shelter
 - Shelter repair (three elements):
 - Safe construction training 2301
 - families trained in 18 barangays to date Coco-lumber milling 4313 pieces (42,883 board feet) of lumber in 7 barangays to date
 - Repair kits (CGI sheets, tool kits, fixing kits) 640 families to date in 3
 - Transitional (core) shelter: needed in many areas, gap of almost 25,000 houses





CCCM

- 71 bunkhouses under construction, of which 19 are occupied with 331 families. Others scheduled to open
- soon IOM supporting DSWD, PSWD, MSWD through establishment of displacement management focal point system at barangay level, mitigation works and upgrades to bunkhouses and management support to the
- Government
 IOM's position: support displaced
 populations with comprehensive
 CCCM support during
 displacement wherever they are,
 and facilitate alternative solutions
 - as soon as possible.

 In some cases, this may include support to voluntary relocation to relocation sites, provided adequate shelter, basic services and livelihood options are available.





Preparing for the Next Typhoon

- Damage to habitat was
- catastrophic, but evacuation centers were also badly damaged. In case of a new typhoon, the combination of heightened vulnerability plus the lack of safe places to shelter could create a very denourous situation.

 - places to shelter could create a very dangerous situation

 Of the 32 pre-Yolanda ECs in Guiuan municipality, only 3 are usable now. 25 need significant repairs and 4 need to be completely rebuilt.

 Of the 41 pre-Yolanda ECs in Mercedes municipality, 0 are useable now. 36 need significant repairs and 5 need to be completely rebuilt.

 Support to rehabilitation and repair of ECs, combined with additional support to local authorities and
- support to local authorities and vulnerable populations in evacuation planning, emergency preparedness in general and related issues.




