

# IOM Philippines Information Sheet

## **Emergency Preparedness and Response Programme**

#### **Background**

IOM Philippines has been working very closely with the Government of the Philippines in facilitating safe, legal and informed migration with particular focus on repatriating migrants in distress, strengthening the provision of migrant services, mainstreaming migration and development, conducting emergency preparedness and response in disaster areas, and supporting counter trafficking efforts.

Key components of the programme of the Emergency Preparedness and Response Unit (EPRU) include:

- ✓ **Support** to the Philippine Government in rolling out and coordinating response efforts within the Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM), Non-Food Item (NFI) and Shelter sectors;
- Building shelters and providing shelter repair kits for internally displaced persons (IDPs);
- ✓ Repairing and upgrading of evacuation centres and basic community facilities;
- ✓ Providing information management support to the Philippine Government and multi-stakeholders including the gathering and sharing of information on the conditions within evacuation centres through the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM);
- ✓ Organizing capacity building activities to Philippine Government officers and staff on CCCM and information management;
- ✓ **Deployment of mobile health teams** to provide immediate health-related assistance to vulnerable communities in affected areas:
- ✓ Providing emergency livelihood through Cash-for-Work assistance;
- ✓ Providing livelihood rehabilitation support to returning or permanently relocated IDPs.
