## CCCM

- On 29 December, **IOM coordinated a joint assessment mission to the Estancia (Roxas) evacuation centre**, visiting the bunkhouse in Barangay Gogo and the area of the oil spill in Barangay Botongan. The mission included OCHA, WASH, Protection, Nutrition and the Food Clusters with the Mayor of Estancia, DSWD and evacuee families. The mission assured municipal authorities of supporting WASH and other necessary facilities for the bunkhouses and sensitized them about bunkhouse standards. Ten bunkhouses, which are planned for 240 families from the immediate vicinity of the oil spill, are under construction at Barangay Gogo.
- **The CCCM system for the 68 bunkhouses and two tent camps in Eastern Samar and Marabut, Samar, is now active.**
  - IOM conducted a training and workshop to establish the Displacement Management System (DMS) for the bunkhouses in Eastern Samar and Marabut, Samar. All municipalities participated. Local government units and barangay displacement management focal points will have primary responsibility, with backup and assistance from one of the four IOM Mobile Teams who will travel between municipalities with bunkhouses on a regular basis.
  - The DMS in Eastern Samar and Marabut, Samar has created a priority list of bunkhouses. WASH service provider, Oxfam, is using the list to prioritize their WASH interventions. Electricians Without Borders is also using the list to prioritize the installation of generators and other electrical connections at the bunkhouses.
  - The DMS in Eastern Samar and Marabut, Samar is working with local government units and barangay officials to ensure that beneficiary lists respond to established selection criteria, i.e., damage to houses and vulnerability. Vulnerable IDPs are pregnant and lactating women, persons with chronic illness, persons with disabilities, the elderly, unaccompanied minors, children and single-headed person. This is an IOM form which will supplement the DSWD DAFAC cards.
- The 73 tents in the Guiuan tent city, which were damaged by the strong winds and rains last week, are being repaired and some will be replaced, as needed.
- On 30 December in Tacloban, the Mayor's office convened a meeting on bunkhouses to discuss concerns and recommendations regarding

**bunkhouses.** The meeting was attended by the Mayor, the City Housing, the City Social Welfare and Development Office, the Leyte Metropolitan Water District, the Department of Public Works and Highways, DSWD, and Cluster representatives (Shelter, CCCM, Protection, WASH).

- Following a site visit of bunkhouses in Ormoc on 30 December, it has been identified that further improvements are needed to approximate international SPHERE standards. These improvements will be discussed multilaterally with the cluster, local government units, DSWD and the Department of Public Works and Highways.



## Shelter and NFIs

- IOM conducted assessments and distribution of emergency shelter kits (ESKs) in Roxas. Unrelenting rains over last three days have led to the **flooding of 78 municipalities in the lowland areas of Capiz**, resulting in the postponement of assessment and distribution activities in these municipalities. Although flooding has not resulted in serious evacuations, IOM is in contact with OCHA and the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) in Capiz for a potential response. A request was made to OCHA for the provision NFIs for the 14 evacuated families. CCCM, Protection, and Shelter Clusters are readying emergency kits, containing blankets, jerry cans, mats, hygiene kits and cooking sets, for distribution. As the rains are expected to continue until the end of the week, kits are being prepared in case further evacuations will be made in the coming days.
- IOM in Guiuan continues to conduct **training for risk reduction management and community mobilization** in barangays.
- Under the “**Debris to Shelter**” initiative, chainsaw operations are underway in some barangays in Guiuan. In addition, IOM received permission from the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) for the use of downed trees in Eastern Samar. Chainsaws used by IOM have been registered with the PCA.



## Health

- In Tacloban, IOM has delivered a generator set to the Leyte Provincial Hospital.
- A request was made from San Jose (Tacloban) evacuation centre residents for a medical mission as cases of illness were reported, especially, among children. There is no indication of any outbreak but residents requested regular health checks among adults and children in the evacuation centre.



## Protection

- Closely working with the Protection Cluster, IOM is responding to the emergency shelter needs of the indigenous population living in Jamindan municipality, where 602 such families have already been supported and distribution of ESKs to another 500 families is planned for next week.
- In Tacloban, a briefing on counter-trafficking was given to IDP leaders at the Astrodome, San Fernando Elementary School, and Rizal Central School evacuation centres, in coordination with the DSWD counter-trafficking focal. The briefings will also be given to other target evacuation centres. The schedule of the briefings will be determined with the CCCM team.
- IOM is in discussion with DSWD on the target areas for distributing counter-trafficking information, education and communication (IEC) materials in Tacloban.
