


RETURN OF UNDOCUMENTED AFGHANS

Return from Pakistan

A total of **968** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through the Turkham (Nangarhar) and Spin Boldak (Kandahar) border crossings from Oct 29— Nov 04, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). Of the total returnees, 862 were spontaneous returnees and 106 were deported. This number marks a **5% increase** compared to the previous week (923). The total number of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan since 01 January 2017 is now 93,263. IOM provided post-arrival assistance to **88%** of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (851 individuals), including 723 individuals in poor families and 128 individuals in single parent families. The assistance provided includes meals, accommodation, basic medical screening, Non-Food Items (NFIs), onward transportation cash grants and referral services, as well as support from partners.

ACC Registration — Pakistan

As of 27 October 2017, the Government of Pakistan's National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) supported by the Government of Pakistan and IOM has received over 299,000 applications from undocumented Afghans for Afghan Citizen Cards (ACC) across 21 registration centers. The cards themselves are currently in production and have yet to be issued. The registration exercise commenced on 16 August 2017 and is expected to continue into next spring. ACC cards grant undocumented Afghans temporary stay in Pakistan, pending their return to Afghanistan, to regularize their legal status by acquiring a passport and visa.

Situation Overview

IOM is responding to a substantial increase in the return of undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Since 01 January 2017, over 461,000 undocumented Afghans have returned due to diverse push factors, including deteriorating protection space in Pakistan and Iran. This figure represents a significantly lower rate of return than in previous year. Most of those returning have lived outside of Afghanistan for decades, and will need support from the government and humanitarian actors both on arrival and as they seek to reintegrate. As the rate of return is influenced by a number of political, security and other related factors both in Afghanistan and neighboring countries, another surge in returns could occur at any time. IOM estimates that approximately 500,000 undocumented Afghans could return from Pakistan and Iran in 2017, and is working to scale up its support to returnees in coordination with the Government of Afghanistan and other humanitarian partners.

Return from Iran


A total of **18,083** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through the Milak (Nimroz) and Herat (Islam Qala) border crossings between Oct 29—04 Nov 2017, **0.3% more** than in the previous week. Although no official announcement has been made, spontaneous returns and deportations have resumed again through Islam Qala (Herat) since 07 September 2017. Of the total deported undocumented Afghans, 2,501 individuals were deported through Islam Qala (Herat) and 6,104 were deported through Milak (Nimroz). Of those who spontaneously returned, 5,711 returned through Islam Qala (Herat) and 3,767 through Milak (Nimroz). Out of the total deportees, 777 individuals (9%) were deported with family members whereas 7,828 (91%) were deported as individuals. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 01 January 2017 to 367,765. IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **566** (**3%**) undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Centers in Nimroz and Herat, including 296 individuals in Deported Families (DF), 155 Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC), 36 Medical Cases (MC), 30 Special Cases (SC), 16 Poor Family (PF), 15 Unaccompanied Elderly (UAE), 9 Physically Disabled (PD), 6 Drug Addicted (DA), 2 Mentally III (MI) and 1 Chronically III (CI).






