

The Revised Appeal

- Duration: 12 months (January-December 2010)
- Total funding requested: \$1.4 billion
- Funding requested per beneficiary: \$481
- The revised Humanitarian Appeal includes 278 projects submitted by 76 aid organizations
- The initial appeal requested \$562 million (later adjusted to \$577 million) in emergency humanitarian assistance. It was launched on 15 January. It was over 100 percent funded one month later.
- \$674 million has been paid or committed
- \$16 million has been pledged
- Unmet requirement: \$768 million

Earthquake Statistics

- 217,300 dead (2% of the population)
- 300,600 wounded
- 3 million people have been affected (30% of the population)
- 97,000 houses destroyed
- 188,000 houses damaged
- 1.9 million have lost their homes
- Over 500,000 people have left affected areas for outlying departments
- 2 million people require food assistance
- 1.2 million people require shelter support
- 2,500 to 4,600 schools have been affected
- 1.5 million children and teachers require educational support

Milestones in 2010

- Planting seasons: March, June
- Rainy season: April-June and August-November
- Harvests: June, October
- Hurricane season: June-November

Issues of Concern

- Shelter & sanitation before April rainy season to mitigate morbidity due to water-borne diseases
- Rubble removal
- Camp management
- Cash-for-work programmes to support livelihoods
- Restoring livelihoods / economic activities, particularly agricultural support
- Support for earthquake-related disabilities
- Protection concerns, particularly sexual violence in temporary settlements

Haiti Statistics

- Population: 9,761,929 people
- Gross national income per capita: \$660
- Percentage of population living on less than \$1.25 per day: 54.9%
- Prevalence of under-nourishment in total population: 58%
- Food security: 1.8 million people food-insecure prior to the earthquake
- Life expectancy at birth (2007): 53 Male; 55 Female
- Under-five mortality (2007): 79/1,000 Male; 73/1,000 Female
- Number of health workforce (MD+nurse+midwife) per 10,000 people: 4/10,000 in 2000
- UNDP Human Development Index score: 0.532: 149th of 182 countries
