Two important characteristics

- France is a country of immigration since many years
- France has no register of population

Resident populations (« stocks »)

- censuses
- surveys
- national file of foreigners (FNE)

Censuses (1)

- questions :
 - on nationality or nationality at birth
 - on country of birth
 - on year of entering
- Two concepts :
 - citizenship
 - « immigré » : born abroad and not french at birth

Censuses (2)

- problems :
 - of declaration, especially for children
 - of slight underestimating (according to a coverage survey in 1990)

Other sources :

- surveys
 - labor force survey
- national file of foreigners (FNE)
 - but not good for « stocks »

Entries

- administrative sources :
 - national file of foreigners (FNE) : home office
 - asylum seekers : OFPRA
 - workers, families : OMI
- statistic sources
 - census
 - surveys

Exits

- taking away procedures
- pensions for retired living abroad
- information from international organisations or foreign countries (registers, censuses)

In some words

- scarce informations
- poor information on exits
- poor information on migration from and to UE

Prospects for improvement

- national file of foreigners (FNE) : more convenient statistics
- new census : data each year on « stocks » and on entries

What use of statistics ?

- population estimates
- knowledge of socio-demographic characteristics of migrants
- measuring « integration »
- population politics

What problems ?

- Because of :
 - lack and scarcity of information
 - political sensitiveness
- Two problems for the statistician
 - critics on statistics
 - confusion between entries and net migration
