
Introducing the Debate







North-South Dimension; Globalization of Health Services



- Growth in scale of migratory flows
- Sharp rise in demand for health personnel foreseen in developed countries
- Concern for the economic, social and health conditions in poorest countries





- Pull from the rich countries
- General expansion of health care provision
- > Population ageing





- **Effects in the poorest: potentially more dramatic**
- Availability and quality of health care > GMG



Difficulty of measuring the impact

 - Virtual care
- ⇒ "Telehealth" and "telemedicine"
 - Increasing role of private sector
 - Liberalization of health services

- ⇒ Health care: social good and economic good

· A multi-directional phenomenon

 Simultaneous emigration and immigration of professionals



 Mobility of workers, students, trainees and patients





- Majority of health services worldwide: privately financed
- Foreign direct investment (FDI)
 - ⇒ Upgrading and modernizing
 - ⊃ Integrated health company networks
 - ⇒ Unequal access
- Training and career opportunities
- Internal brain drain









The Internal Dimension



- Foreseeable shortage of health workers
 - ⇒ Poor and/or demanding work environment
 - Understaffing and underfunding
- Unequal distribution of human resources for health within a country or region



From Awareness to Action









- Int'l migration of health workers: not a good or bad thing per se
 - Importance of policy and flanking measures
 - Today: unique opportunity to share knowledge & lessons learned
