- > Lack of / poor data, analysis and coordination

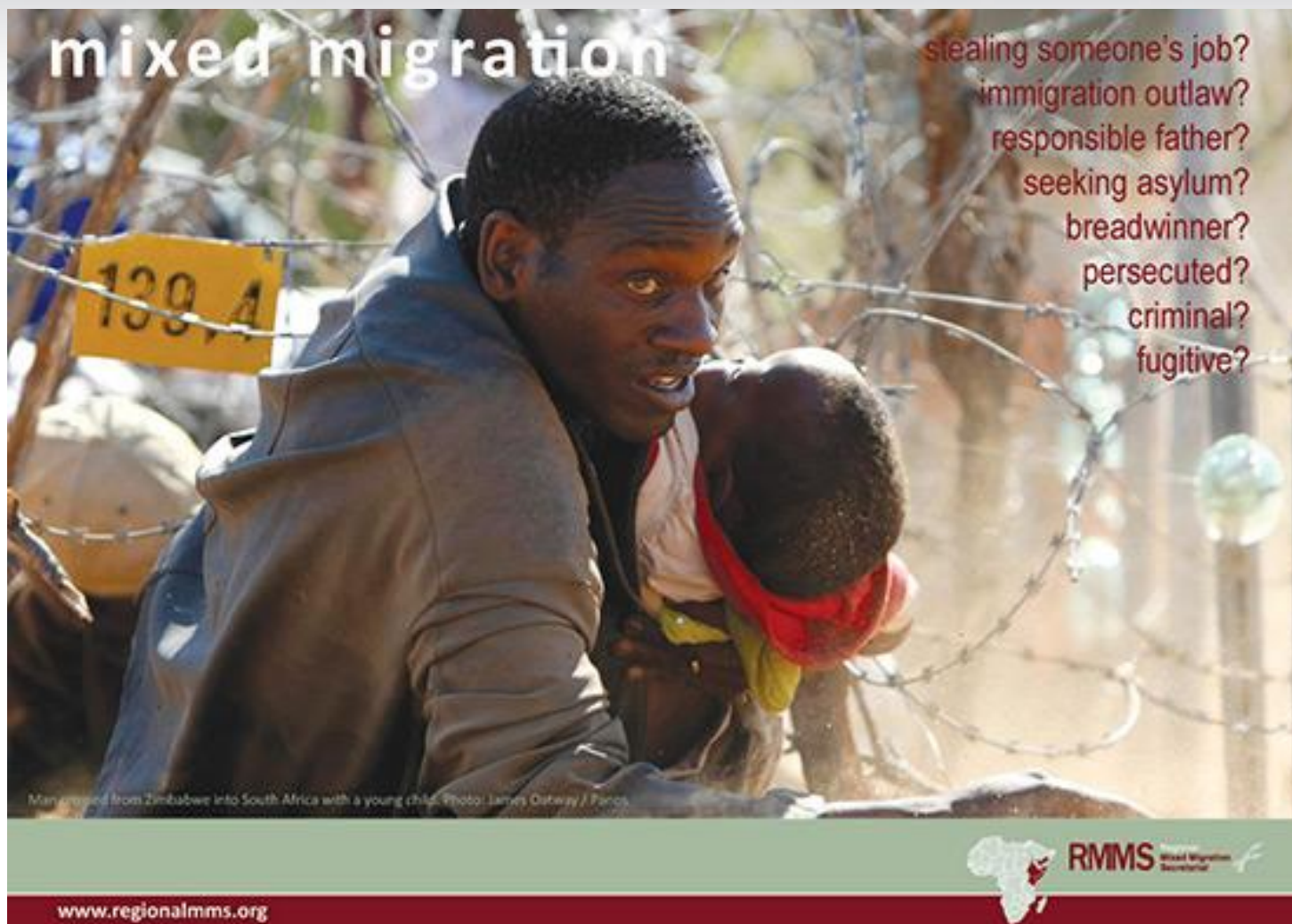
The Building Blocks

#5 Responsibility Sharing – a Must

- > From *Burden Sharing* to **Responsibility Sharing**
- > Abolish piecemeal approach
- > Implementation of *existing* regional & international frameworks – framework for migration
- > Safeguard & expand legal avenues, access to territory
- > Shift from deterrence, securitisation & militarization to protection & treating refugees & migrants with respect and dignity
