Juba Response Update

South Sudan | CCCM | Update #12

In coordination with the Inter-Cluster Working Group, the Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM) Cluster continues to advocate for non-creation of new camp-like settings in Juba. Humanitarian interventions should be aimed at providing temporary emergency assistance that will not serve as a pull factor for IDPs to remain in the sites.

OCHA reports that 14,084 people remain displaced by the insecurity in Juba. Of these, 10,838 people are sheltering in the UN Tong Ping and UN House bases. An estimated 3,246 IDPs are staying in Don Bosco collective center in Gumbo.

UNMISS TONGPING

- Camp Management
- Estimated population figure remains at 4,000.
- Camp management continues to support the movement of IDPs from one location in the site to another to facilitate construction of communal shelters.

Relocation

- The dry run of the relocation route involving all participants of the relocation convoy participants (IOM busses with UNMISS and SPLA escort) will take place today 26 July.
- The relocation is expected to begin on Wednesday 27 July, the planned relocation is contingent on feedback from UN House on preparedness for reception of IDPs.
- 210 IDPs have voluntarily registered for relocation, indicating that they have family or plots at UN House. This group will be prioritized for relocation.
- It is planned for two rotations of relocation convoy to take place, at 0800 hours and 1300 hours.

WASH

- IOM delivered 54,000 liters of safe drinking water at a rate of 13.5L per person per day.
- · Four water points and 30 taps with one tap for 133 people.
- 76 latrines are functional, with 52 person per latrine. 14 hand washing facilities are installed and functional.
- The total sludge de-sludged from the UNMISS latrines is 12 cubic meters.
- 6 cubic meters of de-sludged from UNMISS latrines by UNMISS truck.
- Construction of 10 bathing shelters is ongoing.
- 57 health hygiene promoters (HHP) are on the ground working, with one HHP for every 70 people.
- 50 latrine cleaners (20) and garbage collectors (20) are on the ground and working.
- 30 garbage collection bins have been prepositioned at different sites in the camp.

Health

- · IOM conducted 183 health consultations at its temporary clinic
- 3 new cases of cholera were reported and immediately referred to the Cholera Treatment Centre (CTC) (Juba Teaching Hospital).
- There will be a phased approach to the Oral Cholera Vaccination (OCV) campaign (1) OCV on exit for IDPs relocating to UN House and (2) Mass campaign in the Tong Ping site on 27th and 28th July.
- 172 households (1,402 individuals) were reached with health hygiene promotion messaging.

S&NFI

- Four new shelters have been completed.
- 17 (15 full size shelters for 50 individuals and 2 half size for 25 individuals) completed shelters on site, with the capacity to house 800 individuals.
- · Site development continues with marram spreading and compacting.
- Tents for transit site have been procured and will be installed today 26 July.

IDP Estimates

UNMISS UN HOUSE

CCCM

- · Population of new arrivals remains at 6,838 individuals
- The CCCM Cluster advocacy paper for head count and registration in UN House was
 presented to Humanitarian Country Team and received positively (attached yesterday).
- Relocation: Space within POC3 Zone E has been identified to temporarily hold new arrivals from Tong Ping. Shelter partners are preparing to construct 27 communal shelters each shelter will have the capacity to house 60 people or 1,620 people in total. WASH partners are preparing to construct 40 latrines in Zone E (1:100 ratio), and will install water tanks following identification of space.Health partners have been advised to conduct cholera vaccination of Tong Ping and UN House residents prior to relocation.

WASH

- UNICEF delivered 858,000L of water to PoCs 1 and 3.
- Latrine coverage POC1: 66 persons per latrine; latrine coverage POC3: 35 persons per latrine
- Sewage and garbage collection ongoing in POCs 1 and 3.
- · Hygiene promotion and cholera prevention activities ongoing.

Health

• IMC and MSF are operational in POC1 and POC3, the ambulance continues to move freely.

Shelter


- POC1: New arrivals continue to stay in the NRC school as well as the community center (Hangar 5).
- POC3: New arrivals continue to stay in the NRC school as well as the community center in Zone E.
- Limited space available to construct permanent shelters for the new arrivals. NRC programmes are temporarily suspended because schools are used as shelter.

FSL

- POC1: 2,390 individuals reached with General Food Distribution and 2,268 (including new arrivals) children under the age of five reached with CSB++ distribution.
- POC3: On Saturday 1,024 households (3,439 beneficiaries) were reached with 34.562 Mt of food items
- On Sunday 2,055 households (6,553 beneficiaries) were reached with 65.858 Mt.
- Following the GFD, blanket supplementary feeding program will be completed.Discussions continue to determine how to ensure GFD will also reach new arrivals.

Protection

• Prevention of gender-based violence and child protection and general protection activities are ongoing.
