COUNTER-TRAFFICKING TRAINING MODULES



The International Organization for Migration (IOM) has consolidated its experience into practical “how to” trainings on key counter-trafficking topics:

- INFORMATION CAMPAIGNS
- RETURN AND REINTEGRATION
- CAPACITY BUILDING
- COOPERATION AND NETWORKING
- VICTIM IDENTIFICATION AND INTERVIEWING TECHNIQUES

The complexity of human trafficking requires targeted training at a variety of levels, from victim service providers to government officials and law enforcement. As part of our work to build capacity and provide technical assistance, the International Organization for Migration (IOM) has created the *IOM Counter-Trafficking Training Modules*.

Adaptable to a training group's specific context, participants obtain an introduction to topics that are essential to a comprehensive, counter-trafficking approach. Each two-day training provides participants with an overview of human trafficking and fundamental components of the topic. Participants receive a workbook, containing practical tools, a glossary of relevant terms, and other important resources.

☘ INFORMATION CAMPAIGNS

Awareness-raising and outreach activities are key to any counter-trafficking response, whether they are informing potential victims, educating the general public, or advertising a counter-trafficking hotline. This training helps participants outline the basic steps to plan and implement a campaign. Key skills such as determining whether you have enough information to develop a campaign, selecting an appropriate strategy, linking information to action, and evaluating impact are covered in this training.

☘ RETURN AND REINTEGRATION

A well-established process for the voluntary return and sustainable reintegration of victims of trafficking lies at the heart of building a comprehensive counter-trafficking response. The Return and Reintegration training provides an overview of the key elements involved in institutionalizing a return and reintegration process – from treating trafficked migrants as victims (not criminals) to establishing a “sphere of protection” for victim services. This training covers four primary areas: victim identification, shelter and recovery, return, and reintegration.

☘ CAPACITY BUILDING

Capacity building is necessary at all levels to effectively combat human trafficking – from front line law enforcement and service providers to policy makers and government officials. This training provides concrete assessment tools and activities to enable participants to evaluate and improve their counter-trafficking response. Issues covered include identifying strengths and weaknesses, using international standards and best practices, and developing anti-trafficking task forces and national action plans.



☘ COOPERATION AND NETWORKING

The complexity of human trafficking makes necessary a multidisciplinary, coordinated response involving all sectors of society. Cooperation and Networking details ways to improve cooperation among relevant stakeholders and provides practical tools to plan and formalize commitments in the short or long term. This training is useful in building anti-trafficking coalitions across and among NGOs, government partners, or other sectors of society.

☘ VICTIM IDENTIFICATION AND INTERVIEWING TECHNIQUES

The overarching goal of victim identification and interviewing techniques is to ensure that appropriate measures can be taken to assist victims of trafficking. Key components of this training include how to identify potential victims, guidelines and safety considerations when conducting interviews, and overcoming systemic challenges.

☘ DIRECT ASSISTANCE

Just as human trafficking is ever-changing and contingent on the local context, providing direct assistance is an ongoing process. This training gives participants a basic understanding of direct assistance and how to develop a multi-agency response. Steps involved in developing, maintaining, and evaluating the necessary services to assist trafficked person are included.

☘ CHILDREN

Trafficking in children is not a discrete act, but a combination of events that may take place in a child's home community, at transit points, and at final destinations. This training explains the impact of the trafficking experience on children. Issues such as the consequences on child health and development, interviewing children, special consideration for return and reintegration, and prevention techniques are addressed.
