

DISPLACEMENT IN MARIB

27 FEBRUARY 2020

SITUATION OVERVIEW





An escalation of conflict activities in late January 2020 has since forced 3,370 households to flee frontline areas in Sana'a, Al Jawf and Marib governorates to safer areas in Al Jawf and Marib governorates. New waves of displacements have occurred since 19 February, as people move toward safer areas in Marib following increased insecurity in Al Jawf. IOM's Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) estimates that 611 households are displaced within Al Jawf (in Al Hazm and Al Khalq districts), and 451 have moved to Marib governorate.

IOM and partners continue to prioritize the provision of safe shelters, essential aid items, emergency health care, clean water and safe sanitation and food across displacement sites in Marib and Al Jawf governorates. Since the increase in hostilities in the two governorates, IOM has provided emergency humanitarian assistance to 15,274 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs). Rapid Response Mechanism (RRM) kits, containing critical hygiene, clothing, dignity and food items, have been distributed to over 2,182 households, and 1,943 households in more than 20 IDP sites have received critical shelter and NFI supplies.

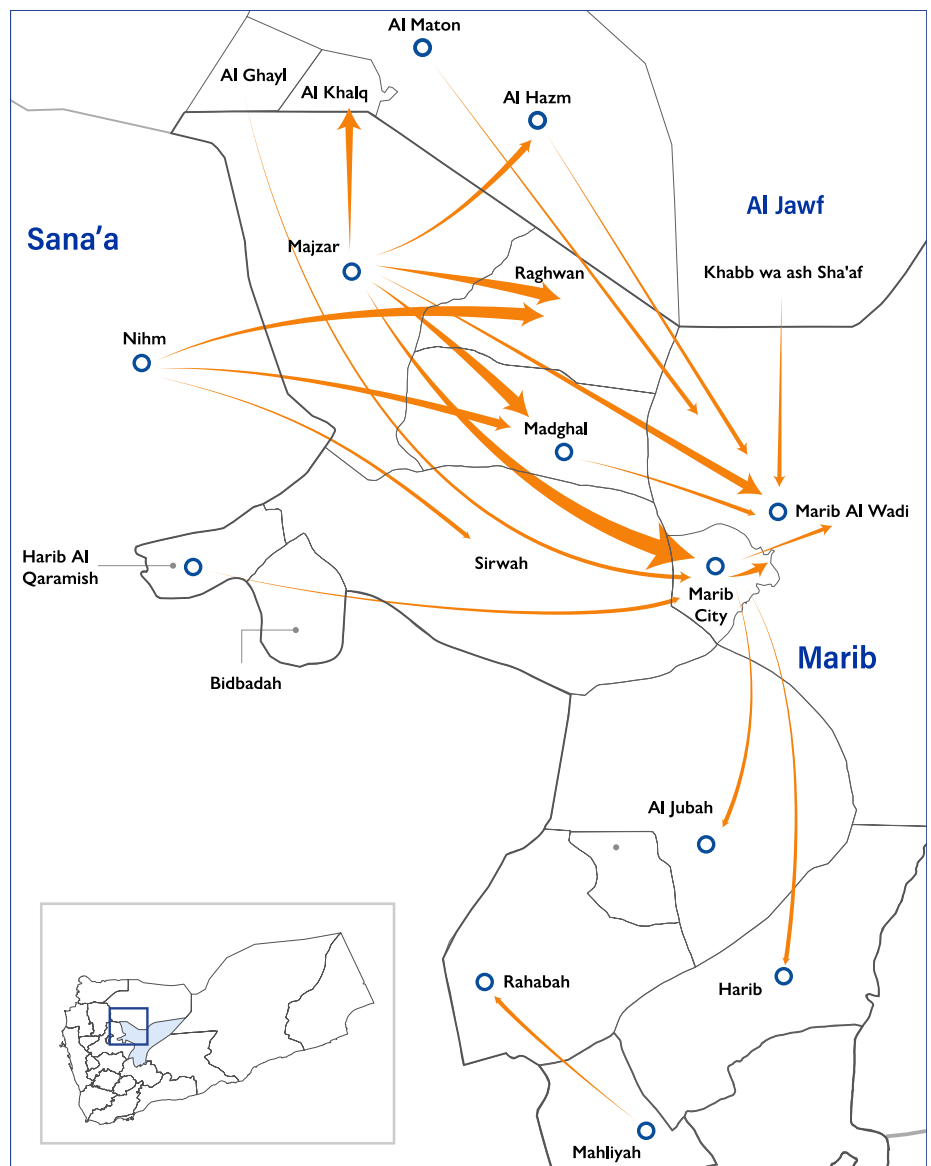

RESPONSE

IOM has been operating in Marib since 2019 and has a team of 14 international and nearly 50 national support and programme staff. As the lead of the CCCM and S-NFI sub-national clusters, and co-lead of the WASH sub-national cluster, IOM is scaling up humanitarian assistance with partners across Marib while supporting the response in Al Jawf.

To monitor displacements and needs, and coordinate service provision in Marib, IOM and the Executive Unit for IDP Camp Management are co-chairing a regular emergency coordination forum, along with non-governmental organizations (NGOs), to identify and respond to needs in the priority sectors of CCCM, S-NFI, WASH, FSL and health. IOM continues to identify and share information on new displacement locations and needs with national and humanitarian partners, and the Executive Unit, in coordination with IOM, regularly shares a humanitarian response tracker with partners.

CAMP COORDINATION & CAMP MANAGEMENT (CCCM)

- **Mobile Operations Centre** effective in Marib City to coordinate response activities.
- **In Al Mil camp (Sirwah district)** 43 plots of land have been demarcated and 35 tents have been installed for new IDPs, through cash for work. All camp residents (185 households) have received solar lamps.



WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE (WASH)

- **Average of 13,000 litres of safe drinking water** trucked per day in three IDP sites. In total, 292,000 litres of safe drinking water provided since 27 January.
- **Seven water tanks** installed in Al Sowayda, Al Khuseef and Al Ma'asher displacement sites.
- **Installation of family latrines** (over 300) ongoing in Marib Al Wadi and Sirwah districts, including the installation of emergency latrines in Al Sowayda camp in Marib Al Wadi district to support families forced to relocate from a public uncompleted building.
- **37 family water tanks distributed** in Marib Al Wadi and Raghwan districts, bringing the total number of family tanks distributed in February to 175 family tanks (500 L each). IOM is providing water on a weekly basis for these tanks; 92,000 liters delivered since 19 February.



SHELTER & NON-FOOD ITEMS (S-NFI) AND RAPID RESPONSE MECHANISM (RRM)

- **2,182 RRM kits** distributed to newly displaced households across Marib governorate. Multi-purpose cash has been transferred to over 50 per cent of these households.
- **1,025 new IDP households** registered for RRM assistance in Medghal and Majzar districts in Marib. 97 per cent of those registered (992 IDP households) have been assisted with RRM kits, plastic sheets and blankets.
- **70 new IDP households** who moved from Al Jawf to Marib city since 19 February received RRM kits, and in some cases, plastic sheets and blankets.
- **Beneficiary targeting, in coordination with partners**, is ongoing ahead of the distribution of 4,000 emergency shelter kits (ESKs) and 3,500 non-food items (NFI) in Marib and Al Jawf.
- **1,200 mosquito nets will be distributed** in Al Wadi district in March.



HEALTH

- **561 newly displaced people in Al Jufainah camp** received health assistance through IOM's mobile clinics.
- **In coordination with the Governorate Health Office**, two additional mobile clinics will cover more than 20 IDP sites in Marib City and Al Wadi districts in March.

CLUSTER RESPONSE

Activities are being coordinated through the CCCM, SNFI, WASH, Health, RRM and Logistics Clusters, at the national and sub-national level.

- The RRM cluster (UNFPA) delivered 800 additional RRM kits to IOM on 25 February, bringing the total number of RRM kits received from the cluster to 2,400.
- WHO, as the lead of the health cluster, is delivering three health kits which contain various medications for primary health care, each kit will provide for 5,000 to 10,000 people through IOM mobile and static health clinics, for three months.
