

DISPLACEMENT IN MARIB

SITUATION OVERVIEW


The International Organization for Migration (IOM) estimates that close to 9,000 households (HHs) have fled conflict affected areas in the Marib and Al Jawf governorates since late January. Internally displaced persons (IDPs) have mainly moved into Marib city, Marib Al Wadi, Medghal and Sirwah districts in Marib governorate. IOM and partners are providing safe shelters, essential aid items, emergency health care, clean water and safe sanitation and food to the new arrivals. Since 21 January, 39,543 IDPs affected by the crisis have received critical assistance.

RESPONSE

IOM has been operating in Marib since 2019 and has a team of 14 international and nearly 50 national support and programme staff. As the lead of the sub-national Health, CCCM and S-NFI Clusters, and co-lead of the sub-national WASH Cluster, IOM is scaling up humanitarian assistance with partners across Marib.

CAMP COORDINATION & CAMP MANAGEMENT (CCCM)

- **Mobile Operations Centre effective** in Marib city to coordinate response activities and respond to the heightened displacement from Al Jawf.

SHELTER & NON-FOOD ITEMS (S-NFI) AND RAPID RESPONSE MECHANISM (RRM)

- **5,659 RRM kits** distributed and 4,686 people received cash transfers (MCPA).
- **3,032 emergency shelter kits (ESK) and 3,247 non-food items (NFI) kits, and 316 tents** distributed by IOM and partners.

HEALTH

- **3,850 newly displaced people** provided with emergency health services in 20 sites through four IOM mobile medical teams and one static clinic.
- **567 children under the age of 5 years screened for malnutrition**; 131 of them were referred for nutritional support.
- **442 children** reached with routine vaccination.
- **110 camp committee members** trained on COVID-19 awareness and prevention.
- **700 pregnant women** reached with ante-natal care.

PROTECTION

- **317 protection interviews** conducted as part of protection screening activities.
- **35 cases assisted** directly with cash assistance.
- **333 cases referred** to IOM teams and other service providers (food, S-NFI, psychosocial support, legal assistance and health); 57 households referred for RRM and MPCA assistance.
- **3 protection risk assessments** conducted in two new IDP hosting sites in Marib city.

CLUSTER RESPONSE

Activities are being coordinated through the CCCM, S-NFI, WASH, Health, RRM and Logistics Clusters at the national and sub-national level.

- The sub-national S-NFI and CCCM, and WASH Clusters in Marib (IOM) are actively coordinating the emergency response, in close partnership with the Executive Unit and UN partners.
- The sub-national Health Cluster in Marib, led by IOM, is working with the Ministry of Public Health and Population (MoPHP) and the governorate's health office to develop a COVID-19 preparedness plan, taking into consideration the new waves of displacement.



WATER, SANITATION & HYGIENE (WASH)

- **24,000 litres** of safe drinking water on average trucked per day to three IDP hosting sites. IOM has distributed a total of 992,900 litres of safe drinking water since 27 January.
- **600 family tanks (500L each)** distributed. IOM is providing water on a weekly basis for these tanks; 567,500 litres delivered since 19 February.
- **17 water points installed** in four sites in Marib Al Wadi and Sirwah districts. IOM is also supervising the installation of over 300 family latrines in these two districts.
- **26 emergency latrines** for 215 households completed (one latrine per 8 HH) constructed in Al Khair camp.
- **1,549 hygiene kits** and 140 jerrycans distributed in three sites, with an additional 1,951 hygiene kits prepositioned.
- **2,372 households** participated in hygiene promotion sessions.
