



The Oncology Institute receives specialized medicines, medical equipment, and medical consumables for oncological treatments.

OVERVIEW

As of 31 May, a total of 109,644 people who fled Ukraine are recorded in the country (6% of whom are third-country nationals) according to the data provided by the General Inspectorate of Border Police.

The Moldovan Oncology Institute received a third lot of specialized medicines, medical equipment, and medical consumables for oncological treatments. The donation, worth USD 150,000, was provided by the International Organization for Migration (IOM) Mission in the Republic of Moldova with generous financial support from the the Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration.

Within this action, IOM and the Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration continue to support the Ministry of Health and the Oncology Institute, particularly through the direct coverage of costs for medical expenses of the oncological diagnosis and treatment for Ukrainian refugees, third-country nationals, and Moldovan citizens.

During the month of May, IOM Moldova provided assistance to over **3,000** refugees and third-country nationals that fled Ukraine due to the crisis.

Since the beginning of the war, February 2022, the IOM Moldova Resettlement and Movement Management Team transferred through air transportation 2,217 refugees to 14 countries: Austria, Germany, France, Greece, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Liechtenstein, Netherlands Norway, Portugal, Spain and Switzerland.

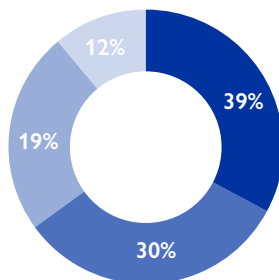
In terms of migration flows, the situation remained stable in the country throughout the month of May, with steady numbers of daily crossings both ways at the border crossing points with Ukraine. People coming from Ukraine who needed transportation continued to use the available transport options into Europe and beyond, and the assistance options available in Moldova.

In May 2023, Moldova has seen **20,096 people** enter from Ukraine (of whom 84% are Ukrainians and 16% are third-country nationals). There was an increase of 22% of people entering as compared to the month of April 2023.

In May alone, **12,887 people** exited Moldova towards Ukraine and Romania through border crossing points and **5,927 exited by flight** to EU Member States or to their country of origin.
