

**First Phase:**  
Safe & Preliminary  
Identification

Time Frame  
**ASAP**  
48 hours

The potential victim of trafficking is preliminary identified in the Levant region

How to preliminary identify a victim of trafficking?

Who can support the preliminary identification of a Victim of trafficking?

**Second Phase:**  
Safe Referral & Formal  
Identification

Time Frame  
**ASAP**  
48 hours

The potential victim of trafficking is referred to the first point of notification and is provided counseling on available assistance options to allow for an informed decision

Potential Victim Identified within L3 Emergency Response

In Depth Screening conducted by a CT Specialist

A risk and needs assessment is performed to provide the victim of trafficking with unconditioned and tailored assistance

In case the victim is a child/unaccompanied child

Family Tracing and Assessment

Best Interest Assessment and Determination (BIAD) by competent child welfare authority

The victim of trafficking expresses fear to return to the country of origin or former habitual residence

The person is formally identified as a victim of trafficking

**Third Phase:**  
Assistance and Protection

Time Frame  
**ASAP**  
3 Months

The case manager engages the victim in the development and implementation of the assistance plan in coordination with service providers and authorities

Victim is provided with access to immediate assistance

Victim is granted access to recovery and reflection period

The victim wants to cooperate in criminal proceedings and granted legal aid & representation

**Fourth Phase:**  
Decision making and implementation of long term & sustainable solution

Time Frame  
**ASAP**  
6 Months

Case manager provides the victim with information on available sustainable solutions and a joint decision is made

Time Frame  
**6 Months**  
1 Year

The victim of trafficking has access to assistance for the implementation of sustainable solutions

The victim is assisted to voluntarily return and reintegrate into the country of origin

The victim is supported towards social inclusion in the country where identification takes place

The victim is given the opportunity to access resettlement programs to a third country or complementary pathways for protection
