349 projects in 87 countries, reaching 5,376,638 beneficiaries

Transition and recovery activities

- ✓ Community stabilization

Supported through activities addressing drivers of violence and conflict



Migration, Environment and Climate Change (MECC)

73 country offices supported the development of policies and norms on MECC

Nature of MECC activities conducted

- ✓ Research and data (reports, DTM, country profiles, etc.)
- ✓ Capacity building (webinars, workshops, online trainings)
- ✓ Policy support
- ✓ Climate change adaptation and mitigation

58 offices conducted disaster prevention or risk reduction activities

68 offices conducted disaster preparedness activities

As a result, 6.2 million individuals were supported to respond and recover from the threats of natural hazards

For example:

IOM Afghanistan assisted communities in building infrastructure adapted to withstand extreme droughts and other impacts of climate change



Livelihoods Assistance/Programming

IOM assisted 802,145 individuals affected by displacement

IOM/IPL Migrant Integration Index

This survey-based measurement tool examines the degree to which migrants have the knowledge, capacities and assets to achieve success in their new place of settlement



In 2021, the Index was piloted in:



with almost 10,000 migrant respondents among migrant populations from Haiti and the Bolivarian Republic of Venezuela



Disarmament, Demobilization and Reintegration (DDR)

2,303 community members benefitting from DDR programming

758 former associates of non-state armed groups fully accepted and reintegrated into communities



Campaigns and Awareness-raising

55 offices supported awareness-raising campaigns targeting civil society organizations, media counterparts and local governments to counter xenophobia and discrimination

17 million people reached, including

5 million Women, girls, and gender diverse individuals
