If IOM requests a smaller vehicle style where an on-board bathroom would not be possible, restroom stops must be provided every two hours and upon request during transit".

3	Does a large business firm preclude them from this RFP?	Please refer on Section 4, Eligibility requirements and Qualification Criteria of the RFP				
4	Can the firm subcontract to certified DOT operators to perform the service?	Please refer on Section 5 Terms of Reference Article 4 on Scope of services and requirements on subcontracting				
5	Regarding the cancellation policy, can the 4-hour notification be negotiated?	IOM is willing to consider adjusting the four-hour advanced notification period.				
6	How far in advance are the movements typically notified to the operator?	Generally, notifications provided on a weekly basis. However, flexibility should be considered due to the dynamic nature of IOM operations as some factors can be beyond IOM controls.				
7	Are both hourly and mileage rates acceptable?	Neither are acceptable, refer to the price schedule using Form K of the RFP. Quotes should be on a per trip basis except for inter-terminal shuttle service, which should be at a daily and monthly rate (Refer to 2.D new price format above).				
8	Are there vehicle requirements over a certain mileage (i.e. motorcoaches with restrooms) regardless of passenger number?	Please refer on Section 5 Terms of Reference Article 4 on Scope of services, vehicles with bathroom on-board is required for trips over two(2) hours. For smaller vehicles without a bathroom on board, restroom stops must be provided every two hours and upon request during transit.				
9	Is there an incumbent currently performing this work?	No incumbent at ORD and IAH.JFK, LAX and IAD do currently have a vendor performing this work.				

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10	In order to provide realistic or complete pricing, can the United Nations apply percentages for each of the 5 major international airports. (Eg., Based on historical numbers, it is expected that 70% of the transportation requests or movements will be from JFK international airport.) 12	Once movement or transportation request is in execution, what is the United Nations expectations or requirements for the immediate direct care of refugees being transported. The service provider must be able to accommodate all refugees and their baggage, including those with mobility/medical equipment needs, such as wheelchairs and oxygen tanks.
		Note that IOM typically provides food for refugees. For some long-haul trips of 3 or more hours, sufficient water and/or meals for all refugee passengers shall be provided on an exceptional basis, upon advanced request by IOM, utilizing the IOM Ground Transportation Request Form (Annex X) to be provided.
13	Does the United Nation require a travel management system that also tracks the transportation of refugees in real time that the United Nation can access?	No
14	If multiple LTAs are established, will UN award by the six international airports? Or will UN issue Orders to which the awardees will bid on them?	LTAs will be awarded on per POE location basis
15	When a travel arrangement is made for a refugee at a particular airport, how long lead time will a Contractor have before their arrival to coordinate ground transportation services?	Generally, notifications provided on a weekly basis. However, flexibility should be considered due to the dynamic nature of IOM operations as some factors can be beyond IOM controls.
16	What is the current process time for background checks provided by IOM?	Average time is 3-5 weeks, but some cases may take longer.
17	Historically what home countries have the refugees been arriving from?	Last fiscal year, refugees resettled to the U.S. were from more than 50 nationalities. Regional allocations may vary from year to year.
