MIGRATION IN THE 2030 AGENDA FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Declaration

- Recognizes the positive contribution of migrants for inclusive growth and sustainable development
- Commits to eradicating forced labor and human trafficking and to end child labor
- Calls for the empowerment of vulnerable groups, including refugees, internally displaced persons and migrants
- Calls for access by all – including migrants – to life-long learning opportunities
- Highlights impact of humanitarian crises and forced displacement of people on development progress

Proposed migration-related indicators

Number of victims of human trafficking per 100,000 persons (5.2, 8.7 and 16.2)

Migration Governance Index (10.7)

Recruitment cost borne by employee as a percentage of yearly income earned in country of destination (10.7)

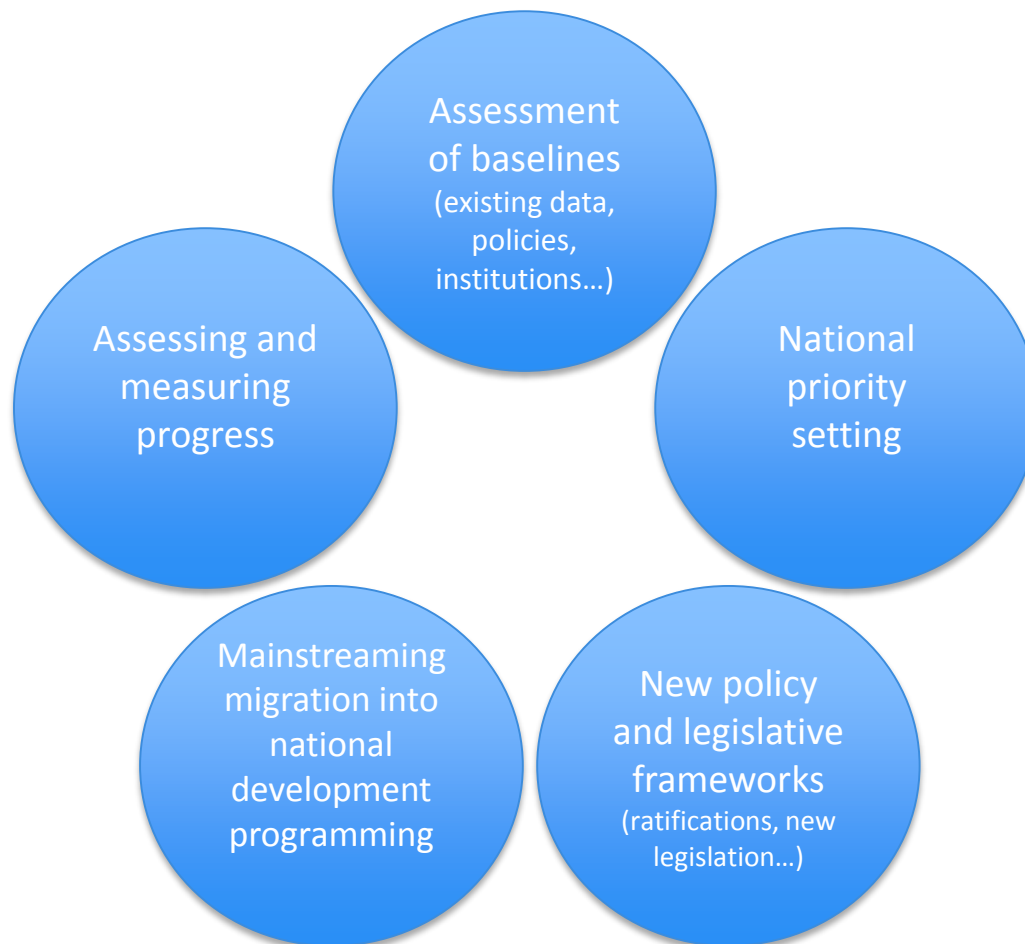
Remittance costs as a percentage of the amount remitted (10.c)

Percentage of refugees and IDPs who have found a durable solution (16.1)

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Implementation



Follow-up and Review

At the national level, government statistical reports, national stakeholder reports, and existing information and data from UN agencies would constitute the main inputs.

At the regional level, it is proposed that Member States identify existing mechanisms and multi-stakeholder processes to engage in peer learning, sharing of best practices, cooperation on trans-boundary issues and discussion on shared targets.

At the global level, the High-level Political Forum (HLPF) on Sustainable Development will lead follow-up and review of SDGs.

What are the key platforms at the global and regional levels that can support implementation, follow-up and review of migration-related targets?

What role should the RCPs play in SDG implementation, follow-up and review?

What would be required to ensure the RCPs alignment with the SDG framework?

How could the RCPs enhance its linkages with other processes and fora in order to support SDG implementation, follow-up and review?
