

RETURN OF UNDOCUMENTED AFGHANS

Return from Pakistan

A total of **987** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through the Turkham (Nangarhar) and Spin Boldak (Kandahar) border crossings from 25—31 March 2018, according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). Of the total returnees, 955 were spontaneous returnees and 31 were deported. This number marks a **37% increase** compared to the previous week (720). The total number of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan since 01 January 2018 is now 6,998. IOM provided post-arrival assistance to **96%** of undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan (946 individuals), including 710 individuals in poor families, 231 individuals in single parent families, 4 Special Cases and 1 Unaccompanied Migrant Child. The assistance provided includes meals, accommodation, basic medical screening, Non-Food Items (NFIs), onward transportation cash grants and referral services, as well as support from partners.

Situation Overview

IOM is responding to a substantial increase in the return of undocumented Afghans from Pakistan and Iran. Since 01 January 2018, over 160,537 undocumented Afghans have returned due to diverse push factors, including deteriorating protection space in Pakistan and Iran. Most of those returning have lived outside of Afghanistan for decades, and will need support from the government and humanitarian actors both on arrival and as they seek to reintegrate. As the rate of return is influenced by a number of political, security and other related factors both in Afghanistan and neighboring countries, another surge in returns could occur at any time. The governments of Afghanistan and Pakistan together with UN counterparts have now extended Proof of Registration cards for 1.4m Afghan refugees in Pakistan to 30 June 2018 and have begun the issuance of Afghan Citizenship Cards on 16 February for more than 850,000 undocumented Afghans. IOM is working to scale up its support to returnees in coordination with the Government of Afghanistan and other humanitarian partners in line with the 2018 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP).

Extension of PoR cards and Issuance of ACC Cards The Government of Pakistan has extended the validity of

Proof of Registration cards to 1.4m Afghan refugees until 30 June 2018 pending further review after the upcoming Pakistani Federal election and appointment of a new Cabinet. In addition, the National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA) has begun the issuance of Afghan Citizen Cards for over 878,000 undocumented Afghans who applied to register since 16 August 2017 at 21 registration points across Pakistan. The registration process for ACCs was completed on 28 February. ACC registration centers remain open to continue card distribution. ACCs have a validity of 30 June 2018 and holders are required to return to Afghanistan to regularize by registering for civil documentation including a passport and a Pakistani visa before returning to Pakistan. The approximately 200,000 Afghans who remain undocumented may face deportation. As of 26 March, 2018, 284,964 individuals have received their Afghan Citizen Card.

Return from Iran


A total of **12,047** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through the Milak (Nimroz) and Herat (Islam Qala) border crossings between 25—31 Mar 2018, **60 % More** than in the previous week, which marks an anticipated increase at the end of the Nowrooz holidays. Of the total deported undocumented Afghans, 1,428 individuals were deported through Islam Qala (Herat) and 5,236 were deported through Milak (Nimroz). Of those who spontaneously returned, 4,090 returned through Islam Qala (Herat) and 1,293 through Milak (Nimroz). Out of the total deportees, 632 individuals (9%) were deported with family members whereas 6,032 (91%) were deported as individuals. This brings the total number of undocumented returnees from Iran since 01 January 2018 to 153,539. IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **537 (4%)** undocumented Afghans deported from Iran at its Transit Centers in Nimroz and Herat, including 347 individuals in Deported Families (DF), 50 Unaccompanied Migrant Children (UMC), 40 Special Cases (SC), 24 Single Parents Family (SP), 33 Medical Cases (MC), 22 poor families (PF), 9 Unaccompanied Elderly (UAE), 3 Physical Disabled (PD), 1 Drug Addicted (DA), 7 Single Female (SF) and 1 Mental III.
