

## Undocumented Afghan Returnees Weekly Update 01- 08 October 2016

#### Return From Pakistan:

From I–8 October, a total of **15,122** undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Pakistan through Nangarhar and Kandahar Province's Torkham and Spin Boldak border crossing points according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). **14,560** were spontaneous returnees in family groups and **562** were deported individuals, including I family (4 members). The total number of returnees and deported Undocumented Afghans in the week of I—8 October (**15,122**) represents a **35% increase** in comparison with last week.

During the past week, IOM assisted **4,482 (30%) undocumented Afghans** from the total number of returnees through the Torkham crossing with post-arrival humanitarian assistance including meals and accommodation at the IOM Transit Center, NFIs for families, special assistance to Persons with Specific Needs (PSNs), a one-month food ration from WFP and family and hygiene kits from UNICEF.

# During the month of September, IOM was able to assist 30% (9,703) of the undocumented Afghans among the total returned and deported from Pakistan through Torkham border (32,344).

#### **Return from Iran:**

During the same period a total of 13,412 undocumented Afghans spontaneously returned or were deported from Iran through Herat and Nimroz Province's Islam Qala and Milak border crossing points according to the Border Monitoring Team of the Directorate of Refugees and Repatriation (DoRR). 7,449 were spontaneous returnees of which 6% (442) were families and 94% (7,007) were individuals and 5,963 were deportees 8% (450) were family groups, and 92% (5,513) were individuals.

During the week of 1—8 October IOM provided post-arrival humanitarian assistance to **637 (5%)** undocumented Afghans through Islam Qala and Milak border crossing points at the IOM transit centers in Herat and Nimroz Provinces.

During the month of September, IOM assisted 2% (834) of the undocumented Afghans among the total returned and deported from Iran through Islam Qala and Milak borders (34,553). As per the continued observation of the Border Monitoring Team of the DoRR, about 10% of the Undocumented Afghans returning spontaneously or forcefully from Iran are in need of humanitarian assistance, however, because of limited funding IOM was not able to reach this total.



### Return Projection to 31 December 2016:

The daily average return from 01 August to 08 October stands at a combined 1,731 from Torkham and Spin Boldak crossings. If this trend continues, the total projection for October would be 51,931 and 155,794 for the remainder of 2016. although all returnees are considered vulnerable with the current confirmed funding under the flash appeal, IOM is able to assist 40% (more then 60,000) undocumented Afghans from Pakistan for the remainder of the year.

#### Updates from Humanitarian Partners:

From I August to 8 October, WFP provided onemonth food rations to 2,543 families (17,801 members) in addition to those 1,505 families that have received the full package of post-arrival assistance from IOM.


**UNICEF** provided 1,659 families (11,613 members) with Emergency Family Kits that include bed nets, tarpaulins and jerry cans.

IOM examined a total of 164 patients (72 males and 92 females) and WHO provided essential medicines at the IOM Torkham Transit Center Clinic.


#### **Returnee settlement areas in Kabul:**

From 01 January to 31 August the DoRR Border Monitoring Team at the Torkham border has registered 13,986 who are now resident in Kabul. On the below map, 10,669 persons are listed within the 22 Police Districts of the city with the highest totals in PD's 12, 08 and 05.
