



Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Dnipro Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk, and Luhansk and its office in Kyiv.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

RECENT RESPONSE



A total of 640,000 NFIs have been distributed to beneficiaries or are expected to arrive soon. NFIs have been distributed to 24 different oblasts through a combination of IOM's direct implementation capacity and more than 30 implementing partners.



IOM continued the assessment of collective centres in preparation for CCCM interventions. In the past week, the assessment of 55 collective centres in Ivano-Frankivsk region was completed. In Poltava region, assessments are being conducted and expected to be concluded by the end of this week. Reports identifying the main needs in these centres will be prepared and disseminated.



Light and medium repair works for Shelter and WASH have been completed in 10 collective centres in Uzhhorod, while more are ongoing in Uzhhorod and Vinnytsia. Technical assessments are furthermore under development in Ivano-Frankivsk and Khmelnytskyi regions.



In the past week, IOM has delivered almost 200 washing and drying machines for collective centres to the local authorities in Vinnytsia, Lviv, and Khmelnytskyi regions, and provided hygiene items in Western regions, reaching more than 30,000 beneficiaries. WASH assessments were carried out in Chernivtsi, Vinnytsia, Dnipropetrovsk, Ivano-Frankivsk, and Poltava regions and IOM continues to engage with local authorities to explore modalities of support in identified collective centres.



IOM's mobile clinics deployed in Lviv Oblast have visited 11 locations in the past week and reached more than 1,500 people with primary health-care services and psychological consultations, bringing the total to almost 6,000. 70% of all consultations were to female patients and the most frequent concerns are hypertensive hearth disease, diabetes, acute respiratory infection and PTSD. IOM is also starting lifesaving operations in the east of the country and is in the process of concluding agreements with well-positioned IPs.



186 consultations have taken place through IOM's MHPSS Emotional Support Hotline in the past week. This includes initial consultations and psychological first aid sessions, short- or medium-term psychological counseling and psychotherapy, and psychiatric consultations. More than 2,800 consultations have now been provided through the hotline since the full-scale Russian invasion on 24 February 2022.



In an effort to further improve the targeted provision of support and streamline needs assessments, IOM has developed clear eligibility criteria for its general and specialized **protection support** to vulnerable cases. Such support has to date been provided to a total of 12,237 people since the full-scale Russian invasion of Ukraine, of which more than 10% were reached in the past week.

Open since 2020, the hotline team has expanded to 30 psychologists, in addition to operators and a psychiatrist and has provided more than 2,800 consultations since 24 February.




