



### **KEY FACTS**





Since 24 February 2022, IOM has established presence in Uzhhorod, Lviv, Chernivtsi, Ivano-Frankivsk and Vinnytsia, in addition to its pre-existing field offices in Donetsk and Luhansk and its office in Kyiv.

Warehouses have been set up in Uzhhorod, Berehove, Lviv, Chernivtsi, and Ivano-Frankivsk in Ukraine, as well as in Košice, Slovakia. IOM also avails itself of the Logistics Cluster's services, especially in Rzeszow (Poland), Lviv and Dnipro.

### RECENT RESPONSE



Through IOM's multi-donor pipeline and network of warehouses, large quantities of goods continue to be delivered to Ukraine. These are then distributed through a combination of IOM's direct implementation capacity and more than 30 implementing partners.



People affected by the war in 20 different regions of Ukraine have been reached with non-food items to date. In total, 334,000 NFIs have been or are set to be distributed. In the past week, this included solar lamps, kitchen sets, winterization kits, mattresses, blankets, jerry cans, hygiene kits and clothing sets.



More than 72,500 individuals have been reached by IOM's multi-donor Multi-Purpose Cash (MPC) programme and registrations continue. The geographical coverage will soon be expanded to Dnipro, Zaporizhzhia, Poltava and Sumy Regions.



IOM's mobile shelter repair teams continue to provide small-scale repairs in Zakarpattia region. In addition, IOM is looking into how currently unused buildings can be refurbished to act as shelters. In preparation for the cold season, IOM is not only distributing winterization kits but also exploring appropriate shelter winterization measures.



WASH-related rehabilitation works are ongoing in collective centers in Zakarpattia and an expansion is being prepared through assessments in other regions. IOM is furthermore procuring equipment for solid waste and desludging services and started to install water treatment units in collective centers.



Despite the challenges caused by the acute petrol shortage, IOM continues to operate four mobile clinics in Lviv Region. They visited 10 different locations in Lviv Region and provided medical and psychological consultations for more than 500 patients in the past week. An expansion of the approach to Eastern Regions as well as a communication campaign about available free medical and psychological services are being prepared. In addition, IOM operates a dedicated MHPSS emotional support hotline.



IOM is in ongoing discussions with the EU Delegation to Ukraine, the Ukrainian State Customs Service, EUAM and ICMPD on the opening of two additional border crossing points. These would facilitate the transportation of humanitarian cargo, fuel and grain exports.



General and specialized protection assistance has been provided to more than 7,100 crisis-affected people in 18 regions of Ukraine and IOM continues its awareness raising efforts. This is achieved through an ongoing nationwide trafficking prevention information campaign information campaign with the EU Delegation to Ukraine and the IOM information hotline through which 45,700 consultations have been provided.




